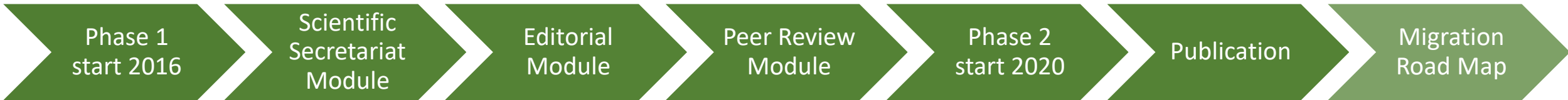

# From 2022 - Indico SPMS Merger



- Phase 1 of project has concluded; full specifications are available at <https://codimd.web.cern.ch/s/d2XPNF5L9>
- Significant progress during the pandemic
  - Scientific secretariat testing carried out during 2021
  - Editorial testing started, to be concluded
- During Team meeting 2021 a priority list was agreed between the Indico team and JACoW, which is captured in phase 2
- Phase 2 project closure expected 2023, with 1 FTE provided from Indico

# From 2023: Indico SPMS Merger



- FEL successful "beta" test for Indico as the primary JACoW tool
- IPAC'23 first major conference
  - Using Indico
  - New mobile application based on Indico
  - Proceedings will be generated with new tool
- Phase 2 project closure still expected 2023, with 1 FTE provided from Indico.
- No more SPMS conferences will be created, currently there are 6 that are in planning

# Indico SPMS Merger



- IPAC'23 second conference executed in Indico
  - Published with CAT tool
- Only remaining item to migrate is the last SPMS instance, commonly referred to as the Central Repository

# Indico SPMS Merger



- First conference published with CAT tool by the local editor
- Work ongoing to migrate the Central Repository
  - Use cases validated
  - Targeted towards the end of this year
- Peer Review module still not complete, not used past IPAC

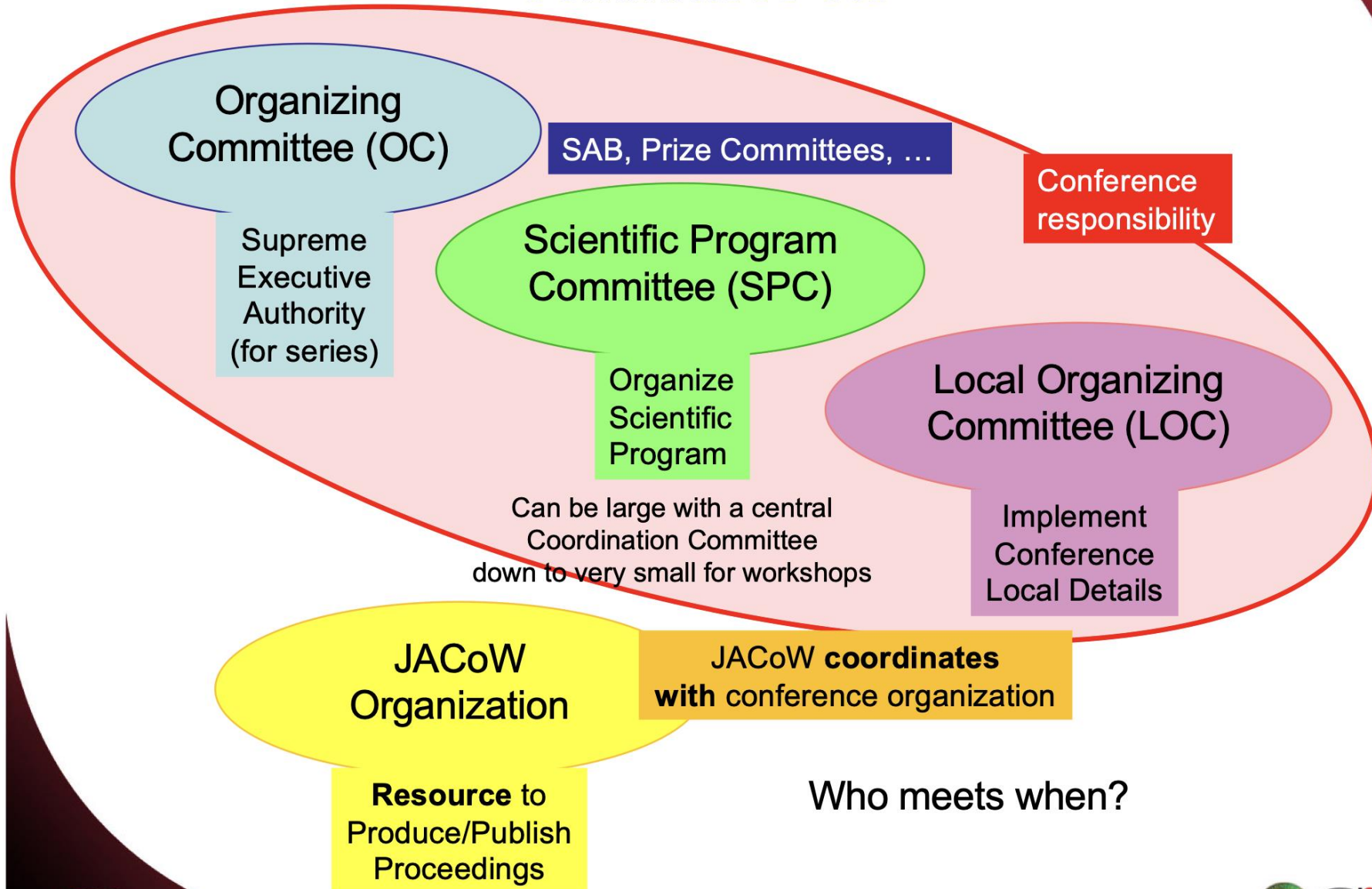

# Not all conferences or workshops are the same

- Here I present some commonalities among many member JACoW conferences and workshops
  - The best authority for how things are done for any given series is someone who has done it before
    - Consistent with the JACoW continuity model
  - Caveat audientia: Your presenter has (strong) IPAC biases
- Many meetings can be (and often are) supplanted by
  - informal organizational processes
  - Phone calls, meetings at other conferences, email, etc
- In the acronym of Larry Wall (designer of Perl): TMTOWTDI (There's More Than One Way To Do It)
  - (Don't even get me started on TMTOWTDIBSCINABTE)

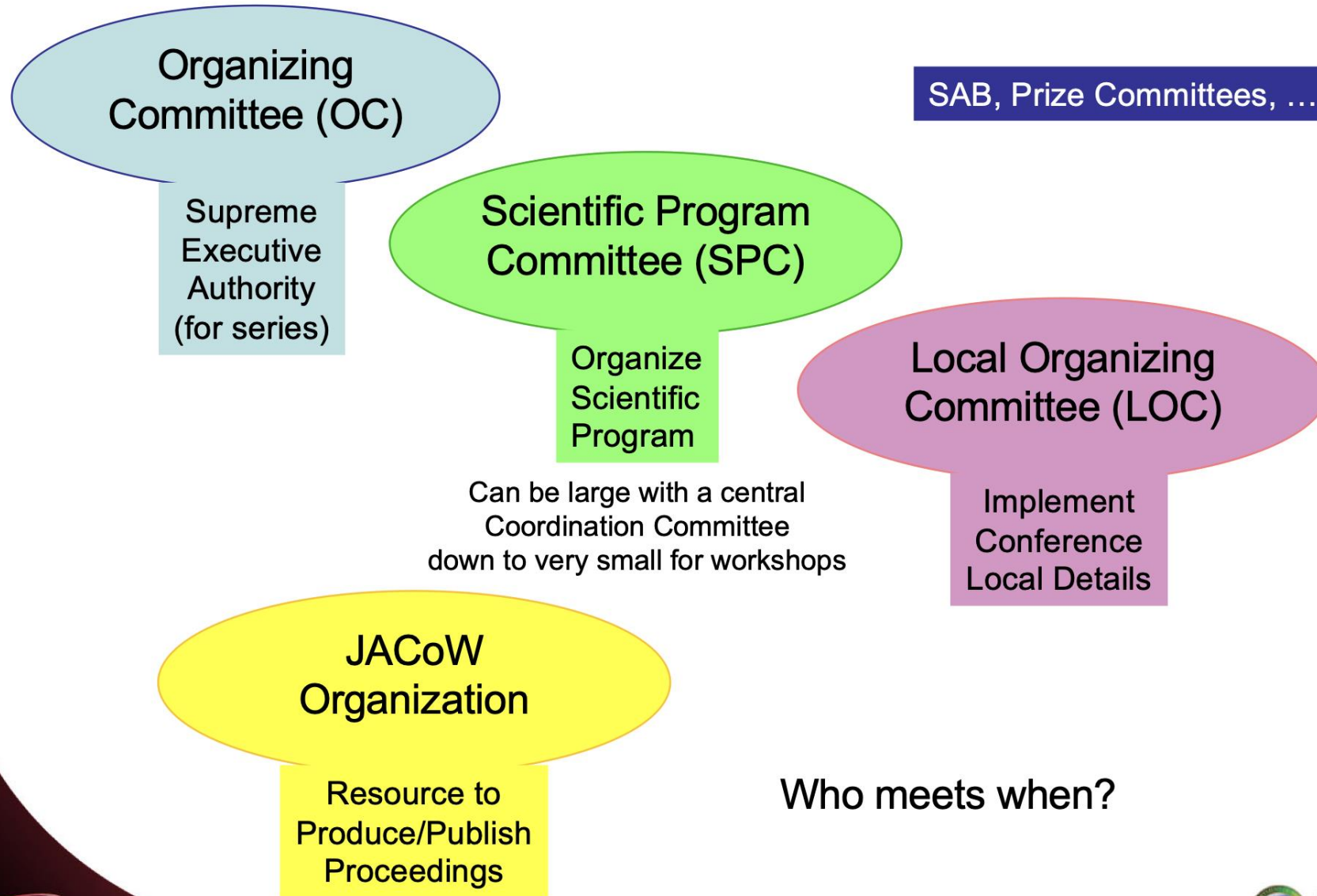

# Committees and Chronology

- The **OC** meets at least once before the conference
  - Tours venue, provides conference mandate, etc
- The **SPC** meets several (~3) times before the conference
  - Advises SPC chair on classifications
  - Organize scientific program, schedule, synoptic table
  - Recommends, selects, invites invited oral contributions
  - Selects contributed oral contributions from submitted abstracts
  - Balance scientific program: topic, geography, gender
- The **LOC** meets *many* times before the conference
  - Organizes all venue and local items
  - Organizes workforce, budget, registration, web pages, IT, etc

# JACoW interacts with portions of all three committees

The OC agrees to JACoW Policies

- Abide by SPMS/Indico agreement (signed by conference chair)
- Editors (and preferably also IT) participate in JACoW Team Meetings for least a three-year cycle
  - Maintains continuity, distributes load and information
- JACoW publishing constraints as detailed at [JACoW.org](http://JACoW.org)

The SPC organizes much of its work through **Indico**

- Recommendations for and voting on invited speakers
- Abstract submission
- Recommendations for and voting on contributed speakers
- Scientific program organization, including statistical balance
- Paper and presentation submission
- Email organization/tracking with authors and committee members

# JACoW's Relationship to Committees: LOC

LOC has greatest interaction with JACoW

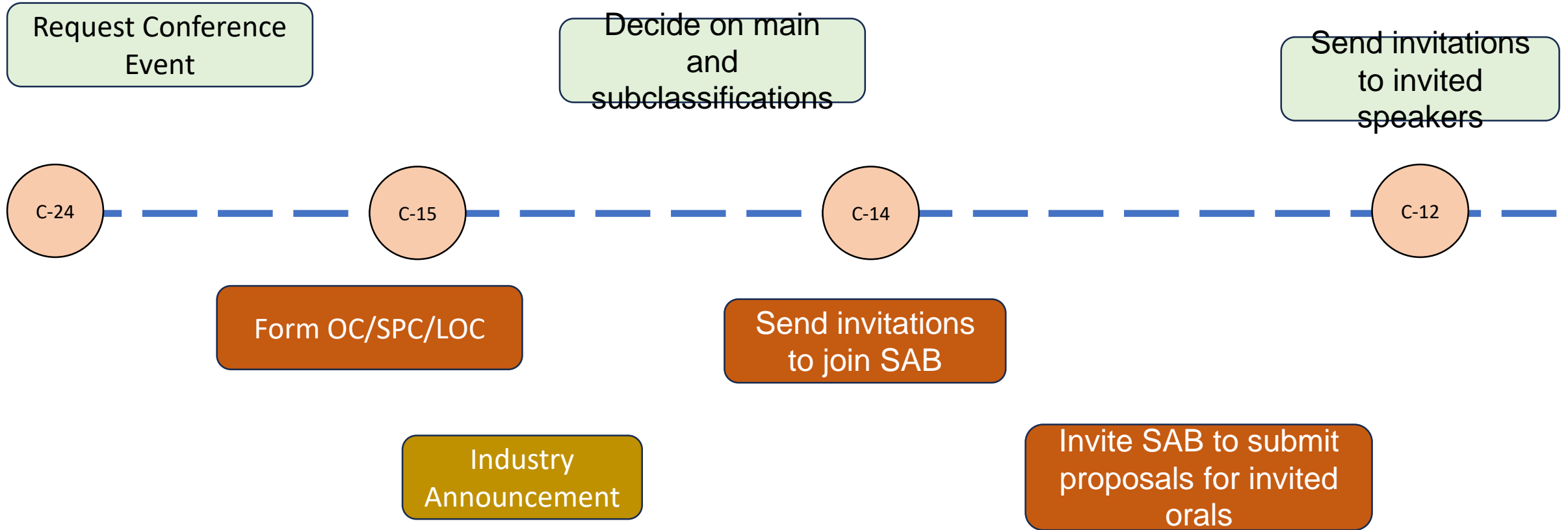
- Personnel and resource management, and budgets, are

The JACoW Events Manager, or a JACoW Officer with Admin privileges on the JACoW-Indico site creates JACoW-Indico instances (events) upon receipt of a formal request to the JACoW Chair or Coordinator.

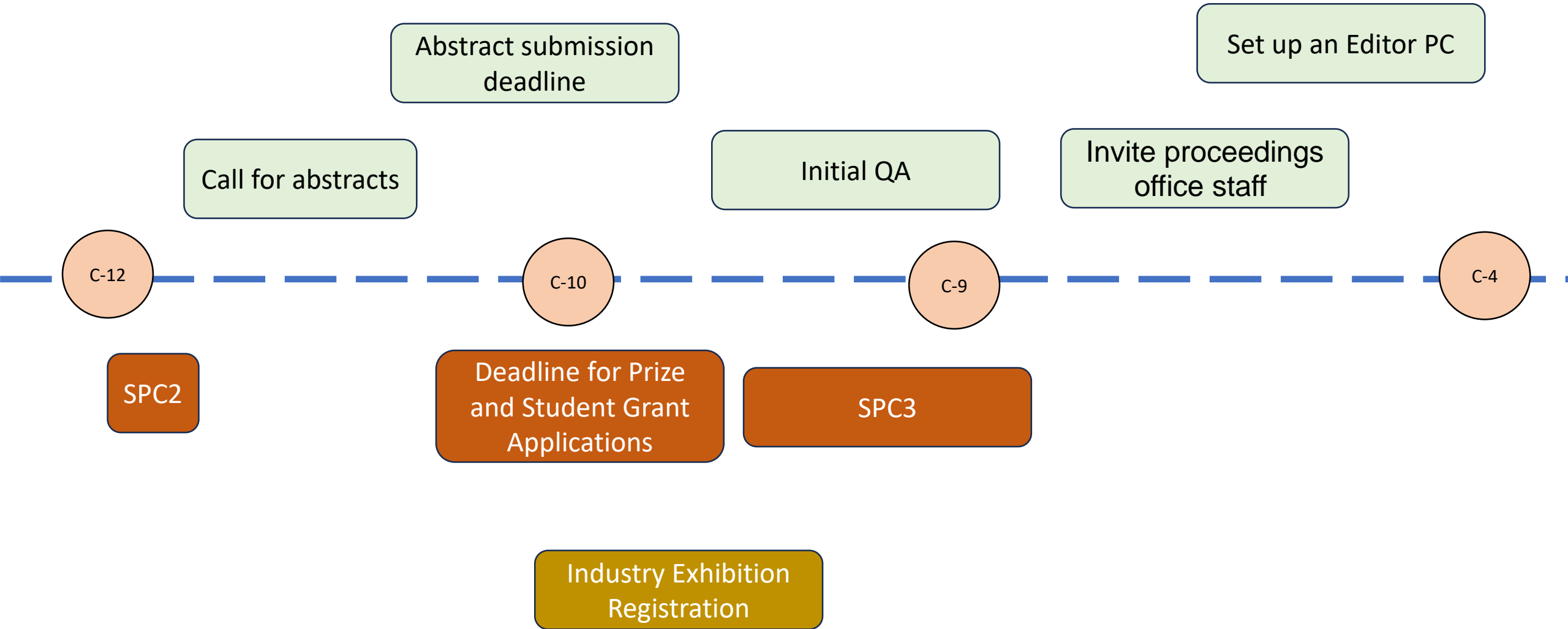

Conference programmes are generally composed of three types of presentation: *Invited Oral*, *Contributed Oral* and *Poster*.

Prior to handing over all proposals to the SPC to decide contributed oral presentations, the Scientific Secretariat/Editor-in-Chief/Admin quality assures all proposals. In JACoW jargon this is known as Abstract Initial QA.

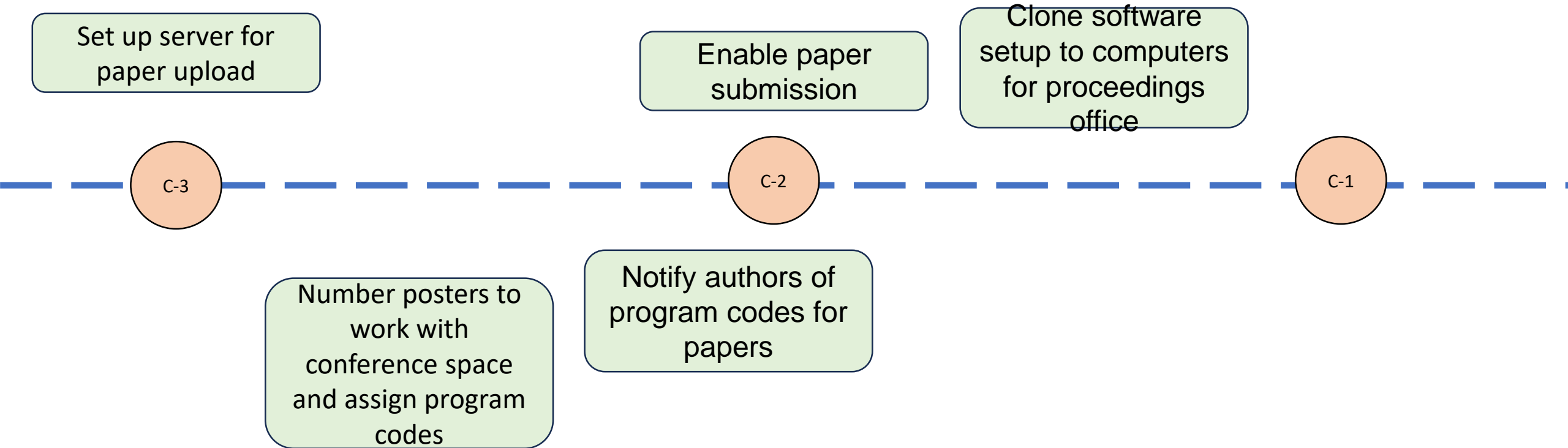

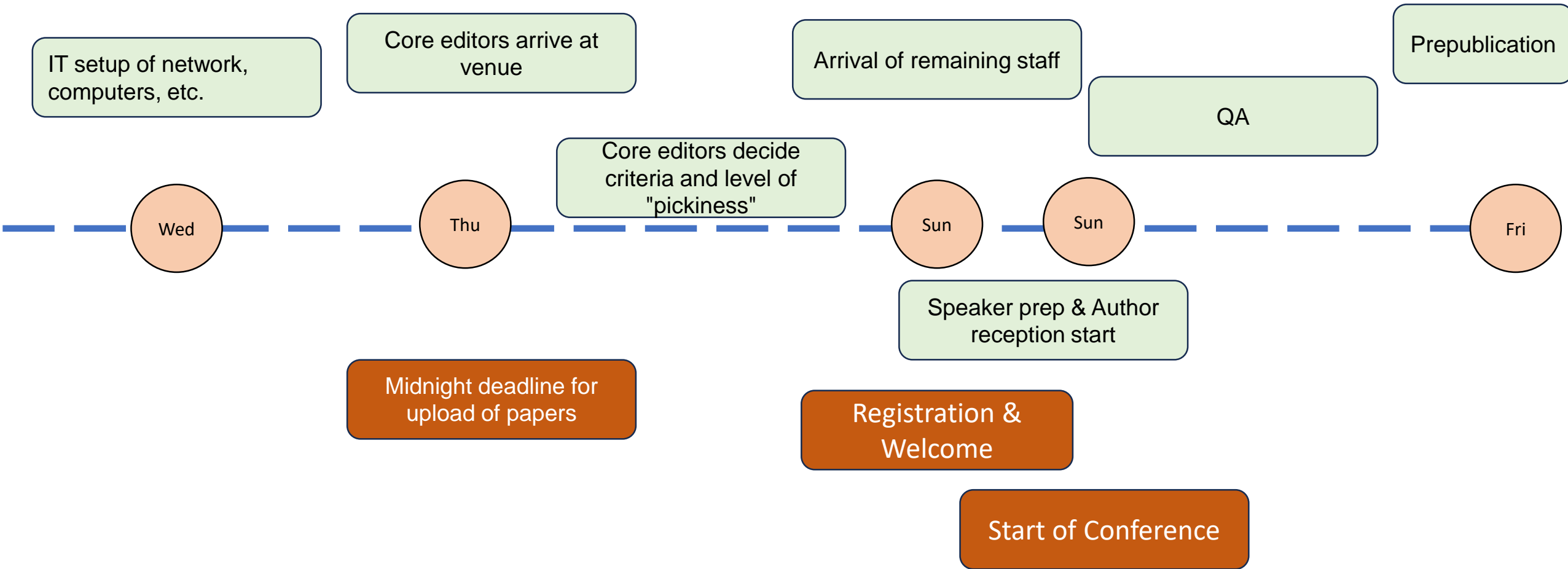
Indico replaces the JACoW File server(s) and hosts all submissions.

Programme codes are used as a unique identifier for a contribution scheduled in the scientific programme. The programme code has until now been used to:

- to provide when/what/where information
- to name the files uploaded for contributions to the proceedings
- for assigning DOIs

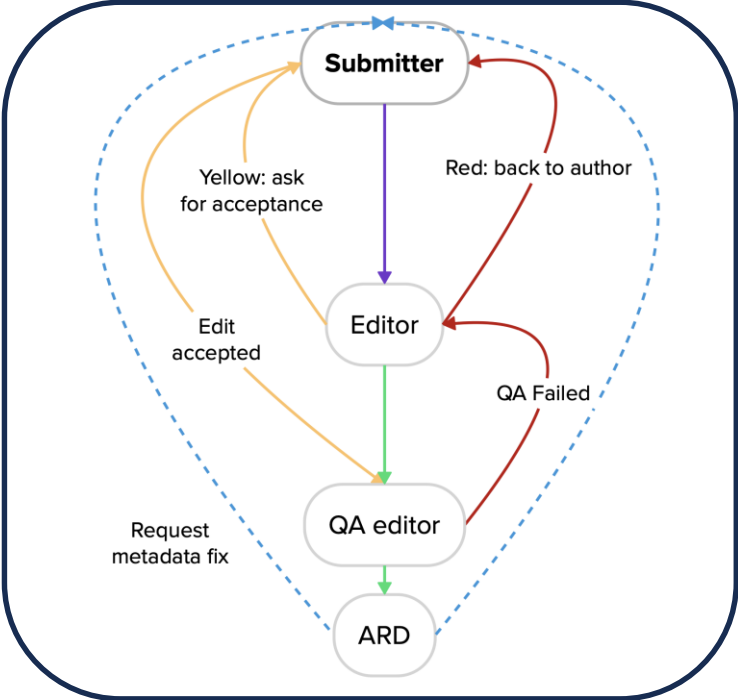

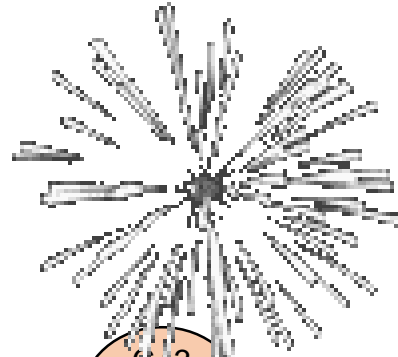
